Daniel 11:36-12:13

When given directions to a remote cabin, these may include various natural landmarks and twists and turns before you finally reach your destination. Knowing these landmarks ahead of time can prepare you for the journey to come until we reach our ultimate destination. Biblical prophecy is much like that. God's Word provides us with images and details that may not make sense right now, but they will become very clear when they begin to unfold before our eyes. Biblical prophecy prepares God's people for what is to come. The closing chapters of Daniel are much like that. We not only see the predicted Antiochus IV Epiphanes, who rose to power, terrorized and killed many of God's people, and profaned the Jewish Temple in 167 BC. We also get a glimpse of a future leader yet to come (Antichrist/ Beast/Man of Lawlessness) who will persecute God's people and claim to be god, immediately preceding the ultimate triumphant return of Christ. We are to stand firm, keep sharing the life-changing Gospel Message of Jesus, and await His glorious return!
